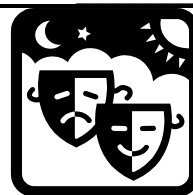
Thanks to our wonderful computer teachers who met on June 17 to share common concerns and improve our

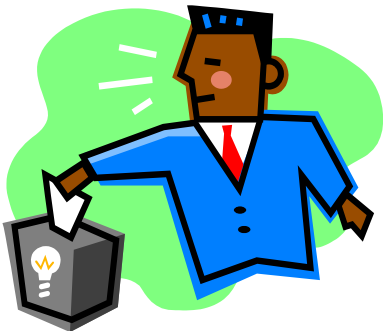
**GROUP TICKETS TO
